Mid Cheshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (MCHFT)

Mid Cheshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust (MCHFT) is the organisation which manages Leighton Hospital, Crewe; the Victoria Infirmary, Northwich and Elmhurst Intermediate care Centre, Winsford. The Trust was originally established as an NHS trust in April 1991 and became a Foundation Trust in April 2008.

It employs approximately 3,700 members of staff and has around 540 hospital beds.

A range of services, including A&E, maternity, outpatients, therapies and children's health are provided for people predominantly from the Crewe, Nantwich, Congleton, Middlewich and Northwich areas, although patients from other areas are also cared for.

In October 2005 the Trust opened a purpose-built NHS Treatment Centre, specializing in day surgery and diagnostics for a range of conditions. In 2008, the Trust supported the opening of a Macmillan Cancer Unit, one of the most modern in the country, which provides a range of cancer treatments and services for patients across Cheshire.

Why choose Leighton Hospital?

A huge benefit of Leighton Hospital is that it scores high in its CQC rating. In October 2014, the Trust and its three sites underwent a comprehensive inspection by the Care Quality Commission (CQC). The report into their findings was published in January 2015, and provided the Trust with an overall rating of "Good", a rating which only a small number of acute hospital trusts in England have achieved.

In May 2014, the Trust was named as one of the best in the country for the third year in a row. The CHKS 40 Top Hospitals award is based on the evaluation of 22 key performance indicators and covers important areas such as safety, clinical effectiveness, health outcomes, efficiency, patient experience and quality of care. In 2012, the Trust also received the 'Most Improved Trust in the Country' award from CHKS, recognizing the progress that the staff and services have made in recent years.

Maternity Services at Leighton

In March 2015, the Trust's Maternity Unit was named "Midwifery Service of the Year" by the Royal College of Midwives. This was followed up in May 2015 with Leighton Hospital being awarded full accreditation from UNICEF's Baby Friendly Initiative.

Women having babies at the Trust are provided with some of the safest care in the country, according to an external assessment which awarded the Maternity service the best possible rating. The Clinical Negligence Scheme for Trusts (CNST) awarded the Trust with Level 3 status after scoring 48 out of 50 against indicators which included the care of women in labour, screening of their mental health, whether they are supported to breastfeed, staffing levels, and the number of



incidents and complaints. The Trust is enormously proud of this achievement. The Maternity Unit at Leighton Hospital has undergone significant refurbishment works over the past few years, including a fully reconfigured Labour Ward and the introduction of a new Midwifery-Led Unit designed to improve the overall birth experience for low-risk pregnancies. The Trust has is now officially named a Baby Friendly hospital with full accreditation from UNICEF.

'Baby Friendly' focuses on staff knowledge and skills to support families with their infant feeding choices. The work undertaken by the Trust's Infant Feeding Team has led to improved health outcomes for mothers and their babies, with the highest breast feeding rates and lowest smoking rates during pregnancy in eight years. A national CQC patient survey rated the Trust as better than most others for the labour and birth elements of the pregnancy journey, scoring a total of 9.1 out of 10 (just 0.3 points of the highest score nationally).

New Theatres and Critical Care Facilities

MCHFT is a modern healthcare facility with state of the art equipment. Spring 2014 saw the first patients treated in the new Theatre suite at Leighton Hospital. Part of the £22.8million project which also saw the creation of a new Critical Care unit, the new

Theatres offer opportunities to further develop existing ways of working in a way that will maximise the benefits of new theatre designs such as barn theatres and integrated theatres. Apart from working in a one of the most modern NHS facilities, working with MCHFT means you'll experience excellent training and development support to get the best progression in your nursing career. Housing in Cheshire

"The analysis shows that the difference in property prices between the North and South is far greater than the difference in salary, meaning in general the Midlands, the North, Scotland and Wales are far more affordable places to live," says John Platt, principal consultant in CACI's property consulting group.

As well as being affordable to live in Cheshire towns and established residential areas are also set in attractive surroundings, and have an outstanding choice of schools and colleges and are in close proximity to airports, mainline railway stations and motorways.

Tarporley is one such location, nestling in beautiful countryside between Crewe and Chester and offering everything from independent boutiques to a world class golf course. It's a hub that serves smaller villages such as the delightfully named Bunbury, just a short distance away. Nantwich is another of Cheshire's pretty historic market towns that is such an attractive place to live with its historic half timber buildings and healthy mix of shops and boutiques. Another appealing location is Malpas with its lively community spirit and country pubs. There is no denying that Cheshire is a much-sought after place to live, with its vast estates, modern houses and wealthy business community. Yet it retains its status as a fashionable location not least because it has some of the country's most delightful countryside juxtaposed to the two great cities of Manchester and Liverpool.

Visitor attractions
